Olive Ross is the oldest living member of St. Mark's. She will be 100 years old on Feb. 22.

Olive's parents were Paul and Etta (Kuhn) Kline. She had seven sisters and four brothers: Mary Delauter, Catherine Eldridge, Virginia Shearer, Madelynne Harp, Gladys Toms, Vera Morgan (living), Norma Biser (living), Merle Kline, Harry Kline, Glenn Kline, and Paul Kline, Jr.

Olive graduated from Middletown High School in 1935. Classmates Esther (Leatherman) Grossnickle and Austin Brandenburg are still living.

Lloyd and Olive had three children: Larry, Linda, and Jim. There are seven grandchildren: Lisa, David, Cristen, Sherri, Daryl, Darren, and Evan. Olive also has nine great-grandchildren.

During her years of employment, Olive worked many years for Raymond Gardenhour in his orchards. She also worked at Doubleday Books in Smithsburg and later at Allenberg Orchards.
