Sept./Oct. Trinity News Sept. 1927

The annual Wolfsville Picnic and Homecoming Day was held in Mrs. Maugan's Grove on Aug. 20, 1927. A very large and quiet crowd was present to enjoy the hospitality of the place and to meet the many friends that assemble there on this annual event.

The Loysville Band was there to furnish music for the occasion. A piano and victrola were furnished by the M. P. Moller Company.
